

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CARDIOLOGY & RESPIROLOGY DVD



Cat.# MS-1I - CARDIOVASCULAR EXAMINATION DVD

The film starts with a brief history, and then a demonstration of the systematic examination of the cardiovascular system in a 63-year old woman with mixed mitral valve disease. It finishes with discussion of examination technique.

Cat.# MS-2I - RESPIRATORY EXAMINATION DVD

The systematic technique for examination of the respiratory system is demonstrated on a normal man. The programme finishes with a discussion of breath sounds, added sounds, and some constellations of physical signs, and the use of the peak flow meter.

Cat.# MS-16I - CARDIAC CASES 1 DVD

On this film four classical cases in adults of congenital, and valvular heart disease are presented, and their physical signs demonstrated. They are: patent ductus arteriosus; atrial septal defect; severe aortic regurgitation; and mixed aortic and mitral valve disease. Each case presentation is followed by a brief relevant discussion. This and the succeeding film together provide an excellent introduction to the diagnosis of such cardiac disorders, with the sounds well recorded.

Cat.# MS-17I - CARDIAC CASES 2 DVD

On this film four classical cases in adults of valvular heart disease are presented, and their physical signs demonstrated. They are: pure mitral stenosis; mitral valve prolapse; mixed mitral valve disease with aortic regurgitation; and cor pulmonale with severe tricuspid regurgitation. Each case presentation is followed by a brief relevant discussion. This and the preceding film together provide an excellent introduction to the diagnosis of such cardiac disorders, with the sounds well recorded.

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Cat.# MS-19I - RESPIRATORY PHYSICAL SIGNS DVD

On this film are demonstrated five patients with different respiratory diseases, who together illustrate many of the respiratory physical signs and how to interpret them. The cases are: consolidation of the left lower lobe due to tuberculosis; acute asthma; long-standing complete atelectatic collapse of the left lung; a large right pleural effusion; and right basal bronchiectasis. The film complements Programme 2 (Examination of the Respiratory System); in this film the sounds are recorded (e.g bronchial breathing, whispering pectoriloquoy, and pleural friction rub).

The full systematic examination of the nervous system demonstrated on a young man with history and physical signs of Multiple Sclerosis (first 30 minutes). Specific aspects of examination technique are then discussed and useful tips and alternative approaches considered. The film naturally divides into two halves, for demonstration purposes.

Cat.# MS-12I - EXAMINATION OF THE EAR, NOSE AND THROAT DVD

The important aspects of examining the throat and neck are first shown in two men, one with loss of voice, and the second with a painless lump in the neck. The systematic examination of the oral cavity and of lymph nodes and other lumps in the neck is expertly demonstrated, with emphasis on the underlying anatomy. The importance of early diagnosis of laryngeal carcinoma and of nasopharyngeal carcinoma is emphasised. Finally, on a normal subject Michael Rothera shows how to examine the ear and nose, including proper use of the auriscope and Thudicum's nasal speculum.

The important equipment is first described, and then a systematic ocular examination demonstrated on two patients. Finally, many of the common examples of eye pathology are reviewed on slides in discussion with Patrick Ho.

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Cat.# MS-14I - DERMATOLOGICAL EXAMINATION DVD

First, the basic principles of taking a dermatological history are demonstrated in a woman with long-standing small plaque psoriasis and one with dermatitis, and their physical findings shown, along with those of a boy with atopic dermatitis and a man with large plaque psoriasis and dystrophic nails. In the discussion, the pathophysiology of psoriasis and eczema are reviewed, and the terminology used to describe skin lesions reviewed on slides.

Cat.# MS-5I - RENAL, BLADDER AND RECTAL EXAMINATION DVD

Systematic approach to the patient with renal colic and a calculus demonstrated first; (interesting differences in examination technique to those shown in programme 4). Specific aspects then illustrated on a patient with polycystic kidneys and one with chronic urinary retention and a distended bladder. Technique of rectal examination then demonstrated on a man with carcinoma of prostate.

Cat.# MS-6I - EXAMINATION OF THE INGUINO-SCROTAL REGION DVD

The technique of examining the groin, scrotum and testes is demonstrated on five men, with respectively varicocoele, hydrocoele, irreducible inguinal hernia in a wide-necked sac, secondary phimosis, and a direct inguinal hernia in a man with previous amputation of penis and groin lymph gland resection for carcinoma of penis.

Cat.# MS-9I - EXAMINATION OF THE SHOULDER AND UPPER LIMB DVD

First, the systematic demonstration of the shoulder, elbow and wrist joints is given on a normal young man, along with the relevant surface anatomy. Then the examination of the hand in a patient with rheumatoid arthritis is demonstrated with particular emphasis on composite function.

Cat.# MS-10I - EXAMINATION OF THE HIP JOINT DVD

First, gait is discussed in general, and the origin of a limp. The systematic examination of the hips is then demonstrated on a man with severe osteoarthritis of both hips, followed by the examination of a normal subject.

Cat.# MS-11I - EXAMINATION OF THE KNEES AND ANKLES DVD

The problem-orientated approach to the examination of the knee is demonstrated in two different subjects with different problems and concerns. First, a younger man with pain, swelling and locking of the knee, (with emphasis on the underlying anatomy); and second in an elderly lady with painful osteoarthritis. Finally, the examination of the ankle is undertaken in a woman with a previous fracture of the ankle and pain on walking.

Systematic alimentary system history and examination demonstrated on three patients - two with chronic liver disease and ascites, and one with acute abdominal pain, and acute intermittent porphyria masquerading as an acute abdomen (which requires a much more gentle approach).

Cat.# MS-27I - PAGET'S DISEASE OF BONE DVD

Paget's Disease of Bone is an extremely common focal bone disease in some parts of the world, notably the North West of England. In this film the disease is explored through the eyes of three patients with a range of severity, and different bones involved. The physical findings, diagnosis and investigation (including bone scans) and treatment with modern bisphosphonate drugs are all illustrated. The film finishes with a discussion of some of the unresolved issues and recent advances in management, based on experience with more than 500 cases in Salford.

The systematic evaluation of the musculo-skeletal system is demonstrated in a young man with acute polyarthritis. The differential diagnosis and treatment of rheumatoid arthritis is then discussed.

On this film, Julian Davis presents a lady with Cushing's syndrome due to a microadenoma of the pituitary (who also has MEN1); David Anderson presents two cases of Nelson's syndrome, and Julian Davis a young man with MEN1 and a large macroprolactinoma. Together they illustrate many important aspects of the diagnosis and treatment of these conditions. 2004

Acromegaly is a chronic disease caused by a growth hormone secreting pituitary tumour. Three cases of acromegaly are presented and together illustrate many of the clinical features of this disease, its diagnosis and its modern medical management, including the use of long-acting somatostatin analogues.

A variety of cases of the neuropathic and vascular foot complications of diabetes are presented and discussed by experts in diabetes and its complications. The prevention, evaluation and management of foot ulcers and gangrene complicating diabetes are comprehensively illustrated.

Cat.# MS-28I - THYROID DISEASE 1: HORMONE DISORDERS DVD

Two patients are demonstrated in this film, showing the extremes of hormonal upset due to autoimmune thyroid disease. The first patient has classical gross myxoedema at a stage that should not be seen nowadays; the transformation after four months on thyroxine is dramatic. The second man has Graves' disease, but had been labelled a respiratory cripple because of silicosis, and this contributed to the missed diagnosis. He too has classical physical signs, including atrial fibrillation (at the outset) and a loud thyroid bruit. The treatment of both disorders is discussed.

Six patients with various causes of Panhypopituitarism are presented who illustrate many of the pitfalls in diagnosis and treatment, and aspects of modern replacement therapy, including the importance of glucocorticoid replacement for surgical and emergency cover, and the use of growth hormone.

Cat.# MS-18I - THE MODERN MANAGEMENT OF PROSTATIC DISEASE DVD

In this film Peter Chan first reviews the important symptoms of prostatic disease, and the examination findings, and the value of prostate specific antigen, and uroflowmetry and ultrasound. Con Metreweli then demonstrates prostatic ultrasound on two patients. Peter Chan then carries out a trans-urethral prostatectomy on one of the patients. The film ends with a discussion of various issues, including medical treatment of both benign and malignant prostatic disease.

Professor Prys-Roberts illustrates many of the principles of modern anaesthesia on two patients - one having a partial thyroidectomy for a large thyroid nodule, and the other an inguinal hernia repair in a man with hypertension.

Cat.# MS-15I - FIVE SIMPLE PRACTICAL PROCEDURES DVD

This film illustrates five simple but important practical procedures (venesection, putting up a drip, arterial puncture, lumbar puncture, and bladder catheterisation - male), which are often poorly taught to medical students. If these techniques are learnt and followed, discomfort to the patient is minimised, and the chances of an inadvertent needlestick injury to the operator, or complications to the patient will be greatly reduced.

Here we see Professor Timothy Kwok of CUHK perform a mini-mental state examination on an 85 year old lady, after getting the history of deteriorating mental function from her son. It's followed by a discussion on how to score in an accurate and repeatable manner.

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Cat.# MS-26I - INSERTION AND CARE OF THE CENTRAL VENOUS PRESSURE LINE DVD

The film starts with a demonstration of the relevant anatomy of the structures in the neck on a pull-apart model. The technique of insertion of a CVP line over a Seldinger guide wire is shown first on one patient under local anaesthetic using the subclavian approach, and then on an anaesthetised patient using an internal jugular approach. The technique for measuring the central venous pressure is then shown, and the film finishes with a discussion of the do's and don'ts of CV Pressure Lines.

Cat.# MS-30I - POLIOMYELITIS AND ACUTE FLACCID PARALYSIS DVD

Dr Khanh is a paediatric neurologist with great experience of polio. On this film he presents two infants, the first a 13-month old boy with pure motor paralysis due to classical acute poliomyelitis, and asymmetrical paralysis of the lower limbs; and the second a three year old boy with symmetrical distal limb weakness due to Guillain-Barr syndrome. The clinical features are well presented, and the differential diagnosis and management fully discussed. The film concludes with new discussions on immunisation strategies against poliomyelitis in developing and developed countries, and the relative merits and risks of live oral versus inactive polio vaccines.

Cat.# MS-39I - CHILDHOOD EXANTHEMS: MEASLES, CHICKENPOX, AND SCARLET FEVER DVD

Measles is one of the most infectious diseases known, with a significant morbidity and mortality, especially in the malnourished. The main features of five cases are demonstrated and treatment discussed. Then seven cases of chickenpox (Varicella) are shown, ranging from a trivial illness in young children to severe disseminated chickenpox in adults. This is followed by a discussion of many of the issues relating to immunisation, and important aspects of treatment. Finally, Dr Heath presents a child with a streptococcal rash, who has also had meningococcal septicaemia; and in the context of this child and another case discusses classical Scarlet Fever, as well as meningococcal disease and its early recognition. This film gets close to giving the viewer real clinical experience of these classical and preventable infectious diseases.

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Cat.# MS-44I - DOG BITE AND RABIES PREVENTION DVD

Most people consider rabies to be a disease of importance solely in the developing world, but it is in fact ubiquitous and remains a perpetual threat even in developed countries. In India alone 30,000 people die from the disease each year, half of them children. Once symptoms (hydrophobia aerophobia or paralysis) have developed death is inevitable. On this film we see graphic cases of rabies and talk to experts from India and the United States about the signs and symptoms, its primary and secondary prevention, different immunisation regimes (especially intradermal), and the dog management programme in India.

This supplementary DVD was made in response to the WHO endorsing the use of intradermal vaccination as a way of rabies prevention. We interview experts at the Thai Red Cross in Bangkok, and the WHO, RITM and San Lazaro Hospital in Manila as well as explore the technique of intradermal vaccination itself.

These dreadful diseases, easily prevented by active immunisation programmes, are still rife in many less fortunate parts of the world. On this film, we explore these two diseases with the help of specialists in Ho Chin Minh City, Vietnam and San Lazaro Hospital, Manila, the Philippines. A total of 10 cases of tetanus, and five of diphtheria well illustrate the horror of these preventable diseases. Discussions also consider the pathophysiology of these classical diseases and immunisation programmes.



Cat.# MS-46I - DENGUE FEVER AND DENGUE HAEMORRHAGIC FEVER DVD

Dengue is caused by four strains of a RNA flavivirus, transmitted by the daytime biting Aedes mosquito, and is primarily a disease of the tropics and subtropics. Thought for long to be a benign infection, the past 50 years has seen a global explosion in Dengue and its complications. Increasing urbanization, crowding and travel mean that we now have a pandemic; furthermore dengue is now considered by WHO to be a serious disease of global importance. On this film we see patients at various stages and of varying degrees of severity, presented by doctors in Manila and Bangkok, and we then hear about the aetiology, prevention, detection, pathophysiology and management of Dengue and Dengue Shock Syndrome.

Cat.# MS-43I - HELICOBACTER PYLORI AND GASTRODUODENAL DISEASE DVD

The Nobel Prize for Medicine in 2005 has been awarded to Warren and Mitchell for the discovery of Helicobacter pylori and its central role in gastro-duodenal disease. On this film we consider all relevant aspects of Helicobacter pylori with the help of authorities in this field. We first look at fourrepresentative cases undergoing upper GI endoscopy followed by an informative clinical discussion. The second part of the film is a detailed discussion with Professor Joseph Sung and Dr Frances Chan, in which we explore important recent developments, including the relevance between H. Pylori and patients treated with Asprin and NSAIDs, non-specific dyspepsia, stomach cancer and difficult antibiotic regimens. As an appendix, we have a demonstration of the cleaning of the endoscope (of especial importance for theatre nurses).

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Cat.# MS-32I - DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF MALARIA DVD

Falciparum malaria is a continuing scourge throughout the tropical world, and a disease with which all doctors should be thoroughly familiar, in these days of extensive air travel. Dr Arnold, was a leading researcher in clinical management of malaria, and is filmed with staff at the Centre for Tropical Diseases in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, where important research in the use of the Artimisinin derivatives, derived from a traditional Chinese remedy Qing Hao, was conducted. First some cases are presented, including one with cerebral malaria (Glasgow Coma score test demonstrated); then the technique of diagnosis including staining of thin and thick blood films is shown, and the parasites of P.falciparum and vivax illustrated. There is then a full discussion with Dr Arnold, with the life cycle of the parasite well illustrated, and treatment and prevention discussed, followed by an updated discussion with world expert in Malaria Professor Sornchai Loowaresan on its prevention and treatment.

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Cat.# MS-45I - LEPROSY DVD

Leprosy is caused by an acid-fast bacillus, and among the communicable diseases is traditionally associated with the greatest fear and social stigma. It affects mainly the skin, and peripheral nerves, and carries the greatest potential for permanent, progressive and obvious disfiguration and disability. In the early stages it is now curable, and on this film we learn about all aspects of the disease through presentation and discussion of 14 patients filmed with experts in China and India.

Cat.# MS-47I - HEPATITIS 1: B AND E DVD

Hepatitis B is a major cause of morbidity and mortality in many parts of the world, with its vertical transmission from mother to child, and its capacity to cause cirrhosis and hepatocellular carcinoma. Immune tolerance, especially in the young plays a major role in chronicity, and ultimately fatal complications. The cases and discussion cover many of the important advances in its understanding and treatment including the use of antiviral drugs, and immunisation. Hepatitis E on the other hand is caused by a food-born RNA virus and the case shown on this film was in a patient with chronic hepatitis B.

Cat.# MS-48I - HEPATITIS 2: A, C AND NON-VIRAL DVD

The DVD first shows a typical case of hepatitis A, illustrating the importance of active immunisation. Hepatitis C, also due to an RNA virus, is quite different in its pathophysiology, being mainly bloodborne, and susceptible to chronicity and ultimately leading to hepatocellular carcinoma. The cases shown and the expert discussions illustrate most of the important aspects of this disease and its (still unsatisfactory) treatment with pegylated interferon and antiviral drugs. Finally, we see and discuss a case of alcoholic hepatitis, and another patient with a classical flapping tremor of liver failure.

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Cat.# MS-29I - CLINICAL MANIFESTATIONS AND TREATMENT OF AIDS DVD


Two doctors explore the Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome, through the eyes of three of their patients in Hong Kong. A Caucasian American businessman presented with pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, and also has cytomegalovirus and oral candidiasis, and incipient cerebral atrophy. A Chinese man presented with Penicillium marneffei pneumonia, and has major anxieties about his family discovering that he has AIDS and is homosexual. J J Chan, a Hong Kong disc jockey who presented with pneumocystis, has eosinophilic folliculitis and now advanced Kaposi's sarcoma. He went public to help increase awareness of AIDS and its prevention in Hong Kong. Together these men illustrate many of the physical and psychological problems of this disease in people with access to advanced medical services. The film also illustrates on a slide presentation many of the general principles of its management and prevention, and how the field has changed in the nine years since the patients were filmed.

This DVD shows aspects of the disorder as you've never seen it before: from within your patient's body. What you see will deepen your understanding of the pathophysiology of shock and will relate your nursing assessments and interventions to those internal developments.







1. Why shock causes lactic acid to accumulate in the blood, causing metabolic acidosis

2. How compensatory mechanisms in cardiogenic shock can create tachycardia and abnormal heart sounds, such as a summation gallop

3. How the juxtaglomerular cells in the kidneys compensate for low blood flow in shock by releasing renin, which triggers the renin-angiotensin-aldosterone system

4. How to best restore blood volume for a patient with hypovolemic shock by administering a crystalloid solution such as normal saline

5. How intra-aortic balloon pump counterpulsation therapy helps treat cardiogenic shock.....and more.
